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

Women's Day

Day was celebrated the
following year on March 19th in
Austria, Denmark, Germany,
and Switzerland.
The date was later changed

to March 8th, and the day has since been celebrated globally as a symbol of women's struggles and achievements. In some countries, it is a national holiday, while in others, it is celebrated with marches, rallies, and

conferences.

The day also celebrates the achievements of women and highlights the contributions they have made to society. From Marie Curie, the first woman to win a Nobel Prize, to Malala Yousafzai, the youngest Nobel Peace Prize laureate, women have made significant contributions in various fields, including science, literature, politics, and human rights.

World Water Day


March 22nd
